Minutes of meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> April, 2018 at 7.17pm

**GTC2704** **APOLOGIES**

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Green, Harrison and Smith.

The Chair (Councillor Harrison) reminded the public that under Standing Order 13A any elector of Goole will be afforded time at the beginning of this session to raise any matters of concern. A time limit of 5 minutes per person will be allowed.

Mr Colin Kane of Carr Lane raised an issue with the Fourth Avenue, Kingsway, and Thorntree Lane children's play areas, and asked why they were all locked up as there are children who would like to use them.

Councillor Blackburn informed Members that Kingsway's children's park is well used. He also informed Members that the other parks were previously used as a resident of the area use to take ownership of a key to open and close the park each day, although as time passes and children grow up there is nobody to do that today. He informed Members that in order to open the parks a resident is needed to take ownership of the key, and that the Council is trying to get more equipment in some of the parks.

Councillor Huntington informed Members that the park on the pub side of Kingsway is in his ward, and isn't actually owned by the Council but is owned by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council. He also informed Members that as well as the key ownership reason, Kingsway park also closed due to systematic drug abuse.

Councillor Head informed Members that the East Riding of Yorkshire Council had spent a lot of money of the park on Chilton Road, and resorted to involving the Police. She informed Members that they attempted to make the park friendlier to its neighbours and residents in the area as there were young adults using it as a place to meet up and use drugs, as a subsequent beer bottles and needles were found in the play area. She informed Members that there is still some good equipment in the park.

The Town Clerk informed Members that the East Riding of Yorkshire Council had told him that it wasn't their policy to run skate ramps, so for this reasoning and the others mentioned it was shut.

Councillor Crawford suggested to Members making an appeal in the local press to attempt to find a key holder for the parks. He informed Members that if the town is to have children's parks then they should be used for that purpose, and if not the East Riding of Yorkshire Council should remove them.

Councillor Head informed Members that the East Riding of Yorkshire Council don't know what to do with the empty land if the parks were removed.

Councillor Blackburn informed Members that the Malvern Road equipment should be moved to the Kingsway playing field as the playing field is often used.

Councillor O'Neil informed Members that the same problems had been faced with the Fifth Avenue park, it had to close down and there is now no equipment there. She informed Members that she does believe that parks attract anti-social behaviour and that key holder should be available.

Councillor Frost **PROPOSED** that the Council approaches the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to have to Malvern Road equipment moved to the Kingsway Playing Field.

This was **SECONDED** by Councillor Blackburn.
